Summer FAQ's

Can I still select my classes for next year?

Students were given the opportunity to select their electives for next school year through their English classes and throughout lunches on make-up days. Course selections are now closed for next school year. Counselors will create schedules based on what students need for graduation.

During orientation, students will be able to review their schedule and sign up for select electives (based on availability), request changes based on errors (duplicate courses, wrong course, etc.).

I need to take summer school; how can I do that?

Summer school is only offered for outgoing seniors. All other students can choose to retake any courses that they failed through FLVS. Please log into your Focus account to see any courses that you may need to retake. You can then go to FLVS.net and register as a FLEX student to request any classes you may need. Please keep in mind that courses do not register on our transcripts immediately after completion, so promotion to the next grade may not happen right away. These courses must be manually entered.

Why did my child not promote?

The promotion guidelines are as follows:

TO 10th grade: 5 credits including 1 English or 1 Math

TO 11th grade: 12 credits including 2 English AND 2 Math/Science credits

TO 12th: 18 credits including 3 English and 4 Math/Science Credits and a 1.5 GPA

IF your child did not promote, they may take the classes that they need on FLVS (up to 3 classes). Please keep in mind that students only repeat the needed classes NOT the entire year. They will continue to take the courses needed for graduation.

Depending on your child's current progress, a follow-up summer meeting will be requested.

Half-Day Schedules (Rising Seniors):

If you are a rising SENIOR and have met your Reading, Math, Acceleration, and all other Graduation Requirements, you may be eligible for a half-day schedule! Please call main office to ensure you qualify before picking up a form.

Final Transcripts:

Final transcripts will be submitted to colleges over the summer. If you have already requested a transcript, this will be taken care of automatically. If you have not requested a transcript, then you can complete a *Transcript Request Form* in the main office Monday-Thursday from 8:00am-3:00pm. Transcripts can be picked up on Thursdays between the hours of 8:00am-1:00pm.
