



Plagiarism

Plagiarism—to present the ideas or words of another as one's own.

Cheating—to practice fraud or deception; to behave dishonestly.

Examples of Plagiarism/Cheating

- Buying or downloading a paper from a research service or online paper mill and offering it as your own.
- Turning in another student's work, with or without a student's knowledge, as your own.
- Copying any portion of another's work without proper acknowledgment or permission.
- Paraphrasing (putting in your own words) ideas and language from a source without proper documentation.
- Copying material from a source and supplying proper documentation, but leaving out quotation marks.
- Cutting and pasting information from websites or online source and representing it as your own work.
- Forging the signature of a parent/guardian

Possible Consequences for Plagiarizing: parent will be notified, involved student(s) will receive no credit for the assignment or assessment and a Class II referral will be forwarded to House Administration
