

2009 Summer School Programs

The dates for Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten will be from June 17th – August 7th with no school on July 3rd. The VPK students' instructional days will be Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

The dates for the ESE Extended School Year will be from June 22th through July 17th (19 days) with no school on July 3rd. Students' instructional days will be Monday through Friday (elementary 8:45am-3:15pm and secondary 7:15am-1:45pm).

DCPS Summer School, The Superintendent's Academies, and ESOL Maintenance Program will be from June 22-July 31 (29 days) with no school on July 3rd. However, Students in Grades 1 & 2 will attend from June 22-July 17th (19 days.) Students' instructional days will be Monday through Friday (elementary 8:45am-3:15pm and secondary 7:15am-1:45pm).

DCPS District-wide Summer School Opportunities

Summer School Eligibility

Only Duval County Public School students may attend summer school for promotion or for credit/course recovery. Duval students who attend summer school at any school outside DCPS **MUST** have their principal's approval **prior to** attending. (See your school for a form.)

Attendance Policy

Students who attend summer school for promotion/credit recovery may not miss more than 4 days in the six week (29 day) summer program.

Registration

Forms are available for summer school registration at your child's school. There is no cost to attend.

Transportation

Transportation will be provided to elementary students for all programs, and to middle and high school students attending an ESE extended school year program or ESOL maintenance program if the residence is more than 2 miles from their summer school site. All other middle and high school students will be provided JTA bus passes. Questions about bus stops can be directed to the summer school sites after June 12th or the Transportation Department at 858-6200.

- Grades 1 & 2 Summer Enrichment: If your child is **currently** a 1st or 2nd grade student but scored at "High Risk" this year on DIBELS, this 4-week program is for you. Students will work on strategies focused on the building blocks of reading. Attendance policy applies. This program is **NOT for promotion**. All students will attend one of twelve summer school sites.
- Grade 3 Summer FCAT Recovery: If your child would have been promoted to 4th grade except he or she scored at FCAT Reading Level 1, this 6-week program is for you. (This program will also accept students who scored at FCAT Reading Level 1 **and** failed reading on the report card.) Students will work on

a portfolio and prepare for an exit test through a rigorous curriculum and intervention plan. Attendance policy applies. All students will attend one of twelve summer school sites.

- **Summer Reading Course Recovery:** If your 3rd, 4th, or 5th grade child would have been promoted to the next grade except he or she failed READING only on the report card, this 6-week program is for you. Students will be engaged in a rigorous standards-based reading program to prepare for a grade level exit benchmark test. **Attendance policy applies. All students will attend one of twelve summer school sites.**
- **Summer Math Course Recovery:** If your 3rd, 4th, or 5th grade child would have been promoted to the next grade except he or she failed MATH only on the report card, this 6-week program is for you. Students will be engaged in a rigorous standards-based mathematics program to prepare for a grade level exit benchmark test. **Attendance policy applies. All students will attend one of twelve summer school sites.**
- **Middle & High School Credit Recovery:** If your middle or high school student needs to recover a one credit course (or two half-credit courses in high school), this 6-week, half-day program is for you. Students may attend one of eight middle or high school sites listed for work through the Compass Odyssey computer program. At middle school, Grade 8 students needing one class for promotion will receive top priority. Attendance policy applies.
- **Grade 11 Science Remediation:** If your student would have been promoted to 12th grade except he or she scored at FCAT Science Level 1, this 6-week program is for you. Students may attend one of 8 high school sites for work through the Compass Odyssey computer program in science. Students must pass the course and an exit exam for promotion. Attendance policy applies.

DCPS Superintendent's Reading & Mathematics Academies **(for Turnaround Schools)**

Summer School Eligibility

Only Duval County Public School students who attend **Turnaround and Correct II schools** may attend the Superintendent's Reading and Mathematics Academies. If your Child attended one of the schools listed below, then he/she is eligible for one of the Academies. There is no cost to attend.

Summer School Sites:

Attendance Policy

Students who attend summer school for promotion/credit recovery/bridge may not miss more than 4 days in the 6- week (29 day) summer program.

Transportation

Transportation will be provided to elementary students for all programs, and to middle and high school students attending an ESE extended school year program or ESOL maintenance program if the residence is more than 2 miles from their summer school site. All other middle and high school students will be provided JTA bus passes. Questions about bus stops can be directed to the Transportation Department at 858-6200.

- **Primary Reading Academy:** If your child is currently in kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade **and** scored at "High Risk" on DIBELS, this 4-week program is for you. Students will work on strategies focused on the building blocks of reading. This program is **NOT for promotion**. All students will attend one of five summer school sites.
- **Reading & Mathematics Academy:** If your child has been promoted to 3rd, 4th or 5th grade, but has scored Level 2 in FCAT Reading or Level 1 or 2 in FCAT Mathematics, this 6-week program is for you. Students will be engaged in a rigorous standards-based

reading (3 hours) and mathematics (3 hours) program each day. **Criteria required include mandatory attendance, benchmark testing and successful completion of assignments.**

- **Superintendent's Bridge Academy:** If your child has been promoted to 6th grade or 9th grade, but has scored Level 1 or 2 in FCAT Reading and/or FCAT Mathematics, this 6-week is for you. This "bridge" program will support enhancement of the required reading and mathematics skills to be successful in a new middle or high school environment. Grade 6 students will be housed at a middle school. Grade 9 students will attend 3 weeks at a middle school and the last 3 weeks on a high school campus. **Criteria required include mandatory attendance, benchmark testing, and successful completion of assignments.**
- **DCPS, Florida Community College Jacksonville, and Bethel Baptist Church Summer Intervention Academy:** If your high school student needs to recover a one-credit course and has scored at FCAT Level 1 or 2 in reading, mathematics or science, this 6-week, half-day program is for you. The eleven Title I high schools listed on the back of this brochure are eligible. DCPS, FCCJ and Bethel Baptist Institutional Church will partner in offering this unique, structured learning environment to support high school credit recovery in English, mathematics, science, or social studies courses. FCAT support for grade 9 and 10 students is also available. Space is limited. Students may attend FCCJ and Bethel sites for rigorous classroom work with a highly qualified teacher for a 4-hour block. Attendance policy applies.
- **Superintendent's College Bound Academy:** This six-week program is for current 12th grade students and upcoming 11th and 12th grade students who have not passed FCAT Reading or FCAT Mathematics required for graduation. Students will receive extensive ACT/SAT preparation with 3 weeks of reading and 3 weeks of mathematics. The district will pay for ACT/SAT tests in early fall for those who complete the program. The district will also provide (at no cost for each student who completes the course) a one-year subscription to ACT/SAT Online. Students will attend one of 5 Title I sites listed on the back.
