Standard CL1.A — Interpretive Mode

The student comprehends and interprets the classical language in oral and written form within the appropriate cultural context.

CL1A.1 The student comprehends basic oral and written vocabulary, simple phrases and classroom directions through:

- ♦ recognition of level-appropriate vocabulary and grammatical structures
- ♦ recognition of and response to everyday classroom commands
- ♦ reproduction of the sounds of Latin or Greek through recitation and memorization activities
- ♦ recognition of intonation and non-verbal gestures

CL1A.2 The student reads and comprehends simple sentences through:

- ♦ recognition of level-appropriate vocabulary and grammatical structures

CL1A.3 The student comprehends oral and written questions about familiar topics through:

- ♦ understanding of basic Latin or Greek phrases, mottoes and abbreviations used in English
- ♦ recognition of the benefits of classical language study

CL1A.7 The student uses understanding of the classical language and/or culture to reinforce and expand knowledge of other disciplines through:

- ♦ participation in activities with cross-curricular applications
- ♦ interpretation of authentic texts

- ♦ identification of basic Latin or Greek geography
- ♦ sequencing basic events and people from ancient history
- ♦ response to basic questions concerning daily life in the ancient world
- ♦ discussion of similarities and differences between the classical culture and modern culture
