

Dedicated Magnet Programs Priority 1

Priority One for Dedicated Magnet Schools (review of the district's process)

The purpose of these meetings will be to provide data and information about the current process of assigning Priority One within the magnet lottery to those students who are eligible. Generally speaking, these are students who live in the former attendance area of a Dedicated Magnet School.

Please note: students/dependents of active duty military personnel will continue to receive priority placement as required by State Law.

Both meetings will cover the same topics and material. Parents and community members are encouraged to attend for information, and to provide feedback.

Dedicated Magnet Programs Priority 1

Priority One* is available to students who live in the former attendance area of a dedicated magnet school.

This priority gives these students first access to available seats.

*Note: State Law requires that students who are the dependants of active duty military personnel receive placement into a program of their choice within any Duval County School including all magnet schools and all neighborhood schools. Priority 1 is the mechanism we use to assign military dependents to magnet programs.

Dedicated Magnet Programs Priority 1

School Board Policy regarding Priority 1 for neighborhood students:

- “In the case of magnet schools without an assigned attendance area, the District may give a preference for available seats to students who reside in the previous attendance area for the school.”

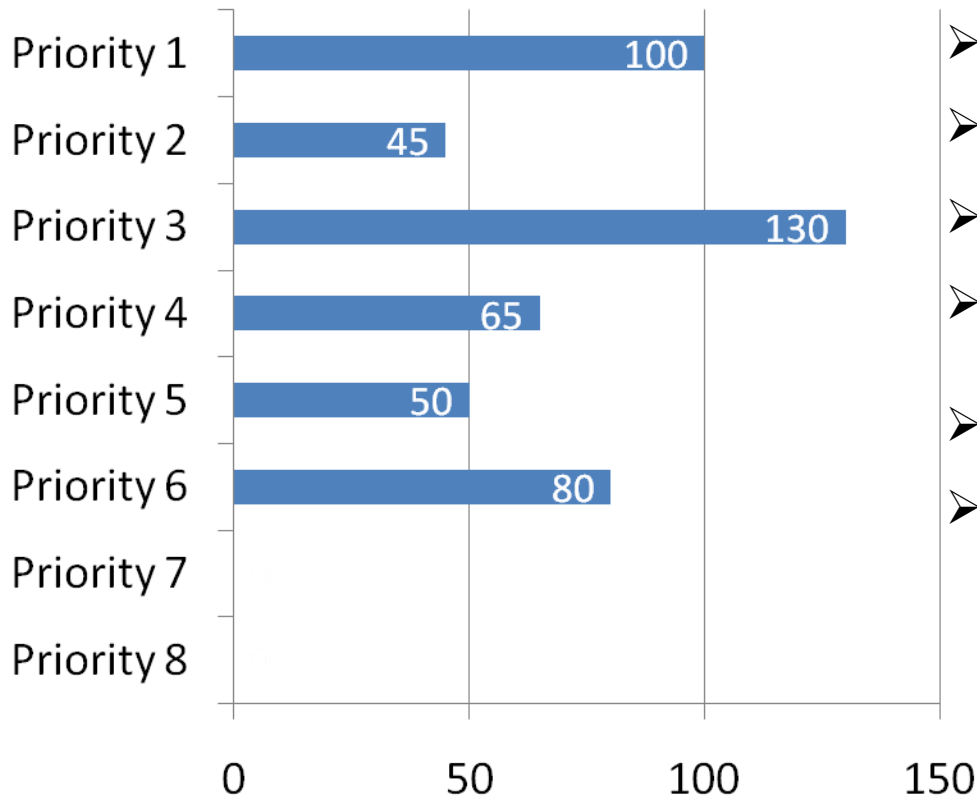

Current Procedure
Assuming 470 Applicants
First Choice

Available Seats

- All 100 Priority 1 are selected
- All 45 Priority 2 are selected
- All 130 Priority 3 are selected
- Within Priority 4; 25 out of 65 will be randomly selected, balance are waitlisted*
- All Priority 5 students are waitlisted*
- All Priority 6 students are waitlisted*

** If the student has not been selected for a second or third choice*

Dedicated Magnet Programs Priority 1

Why are we looking at Priority 1; what are some questions and concerns regarding Priority 1?

- Are there sufficient seats to accommodate program continuity students?
- Are there sufficient seats to accommodate Priority 1 students?
- Does the current procedure enhance or limit district-wide access to magnet programs?
- What is the process if a school relocates?

Dedicated Magnet Programs Priority 1

Why are we looking at Priority 1; what are some questions and concerns regarding Priority 1?

- No guarantee of placement is available regardless of a student's priority in the lottery... however, during the most recent lottery, some program continuity students did not receive assignments to either of their top 2 choices.

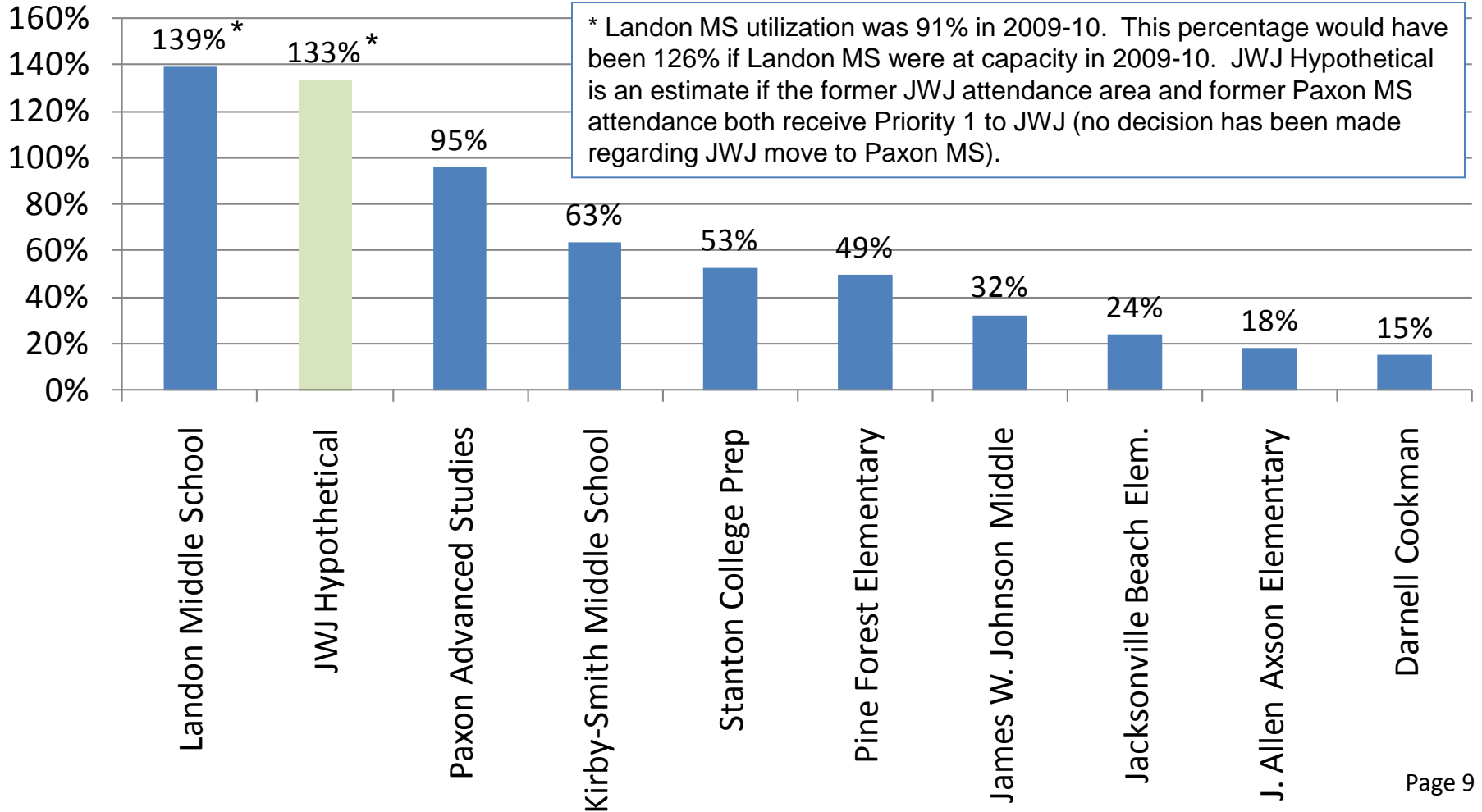
