### **What is Project PASS?**

Project PASS is an initiative sponsored by Project Reach and the Greater New Jerusalem Baptist Church to provide tutorial assistance to students in preparation for the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT). The initiative also has a unique component that has been designed to empower, educate, and motivate parents/guardians. Parents and students attend the sessions together.

### **Where will sessions be held and when will Project PASS begin?**

Project PASS will be held at Mattie V. Rutherford School – 1514 Hubbard Street. Sessions will begin Saturday, January 31<sup>st</sup> and will continue each Saturday through March 7<sup>th</sup>. Classes are from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Lunch will be provided each Saturday from noon to 12:30 p.m.

### **Is Project PASS only for students enrolled in challenged schools?**

No. Project PASS is open to students from any school, grades 1-12. However, an extra effort is extended to students in challenged schools in order to move the challenged school's grade to a satisfactory.
