

# FAQ: Discount/Free Rx at Retail Pharmacy

## ***Should I still present my Medco prescription card at the pharmacies that offer discounts and/or free prescriptions?***

If your medication is on the retail pharmacies' free or discount lists, it is not necessary to provide your Medco prescription card.

## ***Which pharmacies provide discounts and/or free Rx?***

- K-Mart (nationwide)
- Target (nationwide)
- Wal-Mart / Sam's ( in Florida, but not in all states)
- Publix Supermarkets (Florida, Georgia, South Carolina)

## ***Is every medication covered?***

No, only certain medications are covered at the free or discount rates.

## ***Does any of the pharmacies offer free or discounts on diabetic supplies?***

## ***Is there a day supply limit?***

- Kmart - 30-day supply/90-day supply
- Target - 30-day supply/90-day supply
- Wal-Mart/Sam's - 30-day supply/90-day supply
- Publix - free prescriptions of select oral antibiotics and diabetic medications, up to a 14-day supply.

## ***How much will I be charged if the actual cost of the medication is less than the discount amount?***

You will pay the lesser of the actual cost and the discount amount.

## ***What are some of the free prescriptions available at Publix?***

Amoxicillin	Ampicillin
Cephalexin (capsules and suspension only)	Sulfamethoxazole/Trimethoprim (SMZ-TMP)
Ciprofloxacin (excluding Ciprofloxacin XR)	Penicillin VK
Doxycycline Hyclate (capsules only)	Metformin (500 mg, 850 mg and 1000 mg)
